5. BOARD BUSINESS

5.A. Water Quality Update

General Manager McIntyre introduced the presentation, noting it was a follow-up to last year's water quality workshop held in September. He then introduced Water/Wastewater Systems Operations & Maintenance Supervisor Dan Martin who provided the Board with an update of determinations and activities since last year's workshop. Mr. Martin provided a history of the District's water system, which dates back to the early 1950's, and discussed the growth and changes it has gone through to support a growing community. He reported that the District currently meets minimum water quality requirements, but strives to go above and beyond those standards. He reported that there are operational updates and refinements already underway including: bolstering staffing, data collection and analysis, standards and specification updates, examination of pump station upgrades to more efficiently move water, and a reinstituted flushing program.

The Board and staff discussed Mr. Martin's presentation and the estimated efforts, budget, and timeline for enhancements to the District's water system and maintenance program. The Board thanked Mr. Martin for his presentation. No formal action was taken.

Director Duarte stated that the step of filing a Notice of Completion was not listed in the agreement and recommended that one be filed upon project completion. Engineering Services Manager Zavadil affirmed that a Notice of Completion is always filed with the county when a project is completed per standard District practice.

Director Duarte MOVED for approval of Item 7.B on the Consent Calendar. Vice President Misheloff SECONDED the MOTION, which CARRIED with FOUR AYES, and ONE ABSENT (HOWARD).

8. BOARD BUSINESS**8.A. Receive Presentation on the Citizens Water Academy**

Community Affairs Supervisor Sue Stephenson reviewed the item for the Board. She gave a presentation highlighting the marketing and outreach efforts made to garner interest from those in the District's service area, the results of said efforts (52 applicants for 30 spots!), the successful, informative, and engaging presentations given by the Senior Management team, the programmatic "lessons learned," and the valuable feedback received from the attendees. The academy was very successful, graduating its first class of 20 students while representing a representative mix of the ratepayers in the District's service area.

The Board and staff discussed the efforts required to create this new program and the solid foundation that has been established for next year's academy. The Board complimented staff's efforts that led to such success, and agreed the more people the District is able to inform about the District and current water issues, the better going forward for the community.

8.B. Review and Provide Direction on the Inaugural Presentations of State of Dublin San Ramon Services District, Fiscal Year 2017-2018

Community Affairs Supervisor Stephenson reviewed the item for the Board. She showed the Board the proposed PowerPoint presentation the District representatives (a Boardmember paired with a Senior Manager) will give to local agencies and various community organizations. The Board and staff discussed the presentation content and structure, as well as the intent to start making the presentations in the fall of this year. The Board was pleased with the proposed presentation and expressed enthusiasm for conducting the presentations to the community.

It is the policy of the Board of Directors of Dublin San Ramon Services District:

That the District participate in only those charitable events and community service activities, or projects which are determined to be in the interests of the communities served by the District, in view of its water, wastewater, and recycled water enterprise responsibilities, as well as its environmental stewardship role. Expenditures or commitments of resources by the District (including staff time) shall serve a District purpose, such as furthering its mission, providing publicity for District initiatives, enhancing outreach to the community, or increasing goodwill.

Participation in any such activity must be sponsored by at least one member of the Board of Directors and presented to the Board for approval, or is pre-authorized by the Board by virtue of being included in this policy and/or included in an approved Operating Budget. At a minimum, any such event shall bear some reasonable connection between it and the mission of the District, which connection shall be stated in the proposal.

The events and activities that are pre-authorized hereby are the following:

1. An event or activity that is directly or indirectly tied to the District or to matters within the jurisdiction of the District, including local, regional, and state events such as a job fair, science fair, a charitable fundraiser sponsored by an utility focused organization such as CASA, ACWA, WEF, etc.;
2. An event or activity that will provide an identifiable and reasonable return to the District in the form of publicity, outreach, or goodwill, in exchange for the District's expenditure of resources (funds, time, facilities, equipment, etc.);
3. Disaster relief assistance to other water or wastewater utilities that results in increasing District staff's knowledge for disaster planning, training, and communications, or that may result in commitments by other utilities to assist the District in the event of a disaster within the District's service area;

4. An event that offers the District the opportunity to distribute District messages related to its mission to the service area (e.g., Day on the Glen Festival, St. Patrick's Day Parade);
5. Use of facilities (as governed by the District Code) by organizations, such as, but not limited to charitable groups, sports organizations, professional organizations, service organizations, scouting organizations;
6. Other charitable fundraising activities that involve raising donations, and include, but are not limited to, the annual United Way fundraising campaign and Daffodil Days (on behalf of the American Cancer Society). Charities must meet IRS rules for non-profit, charitable organizations. To the extent possible, these charities shall benefit the residents of the District's Service Area;
7. Individual charitable or community service activities in which employees voluntarily participate and promote. Any time spent in these efforts must be the employee's time and not during time he or she is paid as a District employee. Individual employees may use District resources on a limited basis to promote legitimate charities in the following ways, without prior approval by the General Manager:
 - Post email messages about the charity in the public folders on Outlook, and/or send information to a limited number of co-workers – the message should make it clear that this is an individual effort, not a District-sponsored activity;
 - Place brochures, fliers, candy for sale, etc. in common employee areas at the District, such as lunchrooms; and,
 - Share information about the activity in a manner that does not interfere with the individual's work or the work of other employees.
8. Individual charitable or community service activities that use additional District resources, such as those listed below, require prior approval from the General Manager or his/her designee:
 - Sending information about the charity by email to "Everyone" or a large number of employees;
 - Spending more than minimal work time organizing or publicizing the charity or activity; and,
 - Arranging for representatives of the charity to present information to employees at a brown-bag session.

The General Manager hereby authorized and directed to implement this policy, and to present to the Board any proposals that are not pre-authorized by this policy.

TITLE: Support Proposition 3, Water Bond on November 2018 Ballot

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Board of Directors adopt, by Resolution, support for Proposition 3, the Water Bond, on the November 2018 ballot.

SUMMARY:

In March, the Board unanimously supported two water bonds: Proposition 68 on the June ballot and a second water bond, not yet numbered, but scheduled for the November ballot. The latter water bond measure now has a number, Proposition 3, and is titled the Water Supply and Water Quality Act of 2018.

If approved by the voters, this citizen's initiative water bond will invest \$8.9 billion dollars in California water infrastructure, including safe drinking water, Sustainable Groundwater Management (SGMA) implementation, watershed restoration, fish and wildlife habitat conservation, infrastructure repair, and many other important water management programs. Specifically, Proposition 3 would provide funding for the following:

- Recycled water and desalination projects (\$800 million)
- Groundwater sustainability agencies to implement their plans (\$640 million)
- Public water system infrastructure improvements to meet safe drinking water standards (\$500 million)
- Forest protection (\$20 million)
- Safe drinking water and wastewater (\$750 million)
- Flood management (\$500 million)
- Stormwater projects (\$400 million)
- Oroville Dam safety (\$222 million)
- Miscellaneous projects the state defines as benefiting disadvantaged communities (\$4 billion)

This bill will benefit individual water users, the environment, and agriculture. With support from across the board – from 92 conservation groups, 18 agricultural organizations, 11 environmental justice organizations, 73 water agencies, 26 local governments, 88 businesses, and others – this balanced water bond proposition will improve water supplies for every part of the state and provide some much-needed investment in California's sustainable water future. Receive Report on the Regional Wastewater Capacity Reserve Fee Installment Payment Program and Direct Staff as to Program Modifications

BACKGROUND

Capacity reserve fees, formerly known as connection fees, are generally collected at the time that water meters are set, or building permits are issued, if a water meter is not required. The fees are based on increased wastewater service demand due to new connection and use, or due to change in use in a building. The fees pay for infrastructure to serve new development through build-out of the Dublin, San Ramon, and Pleasanton service areas.

To assist the cities in its service area with their efforts to attract new restaurants, businesses, and affordable housing, DSRSD offers a Regional Wastewater Capacity Reserve Fee Installment Payment Program (Program) which spreads payment of the regional capacity reserve fees over a period of up to 10 years. To qualify for the Program, a project must be a new commercial, industrial, institutional, or affordable multi-family residential use, and the regional portion of the calculated wastewater capacity reserve fees must fall within the range of \$25,000 - \$100,000.

Businesses that participate in the Program are required to:

- Install an individual water meter on the portion of property that is covered under this program, so that interior water consumption may be measured.
- Provide a 20% down payment of the regional fee, pay an up-front administrative fee of \$3,060, and pay 100% of the local wastewater capacity reserve fees.
- Agree to pay the remaining balance in equal monthly installments, plus 5% per annum interest, for a term not exceeding 10 years.
- Enter into a standard agreement with the District that will be recorded against the property record of the parcel where the business is to be located. The standard agreement must be signed by the fee title property owner.

At this time, thirteen (13) installment payment agreements are active under the Program. No new loans have been requested for over two years.

At the November 7, 2017 DSRSD/City of Dublin Liaison Committee meeting, the City of Dublin has asked that the District review the Program to determine if adjustments may be made to encourage economic development.

DISCUSSION

The Program provides financial relief to new or expanding businesses by deferring up to \$100,000 in fees over 10 years. It promotes economic development within the cities that the District serves by

reducing capital cost of incoming development. It provides the District fee revenue with some certainty over the next 10 years.

Unfortunately, the Program puts the District at risk. The majority of the participants are with restaurants, which have a 30% closure rate in the first year of business according to *National Restaurant Association*. Because of the high closure rate, the deferred payments put the District at risk when a business moves out of the area before paying off its obligation. Furthermore, the Program presents administrative burden to District staff. In addition to the preparation of the agreements, staff must manually track each of the agreements over a period of 10 years. The District charges an administration fee for this effort.

The Program currently has thirteen (13) participants, with installment agreements executed between 2009 and 2016. The District anticipates installment payments from now to 2026 under these agreement. All loans to date are with the Dublin community which is projected to build out over the next 15 years.

No participants have applied for the program in the past two years. In reviewing commercial/institutional development applications over the past two years, five out of the twenty-nine (29) applicants had regional wastewater capacity reserve fees over \$100,000. In the table below, the number of potential participants are indicated should the District have modified the Program to increase maximum eligible fee two years ago.

Maximum Eligible Fee	Number of Participants
\$100,000 to \$500,000	1
\$500,000 to \$2,000,000	4

As discussed above, the Program had no participants in the past two years. Five of the twenty-nine (29) commercial/institutional project applicants in the past two years had regional capacity reserve fees that exceeded the maximum eligible fee limit of \$100,000. The District would need to increase the maximum eligible fee significantly to avail the program to more applicants.

RECOMMENDATION

In April 2018, the District commenced its Regional Wastewater Capacity Reserve Fee Study. Preliminary results show a potential reduction in the fee. The study is anticipated to be completed within the next three months. The potential fee decrease provides economic incentive to more development applicants than the limited incentive the Program provides.

In view of this potential decrease combined with the limited participation in the Program, staff recommends no modifications to the Program at this time.



TITLE: Receive Report on Employee Engagement

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Board of Directors receive a report on Employee Engagement.

SUMMARY:

In November 2017, the Senior Management Team attended the Annual California Public Employment Labor Relations Association Conference. One of the more useful classes at the conference stressed the importance of “employee engagement” as the major contributing factor to the health and productivity of organizations.

At the Annual Leadership Team Retreat in January 2018, the Leadership Team participated in a facilitated discussion on employee engagement, led by Dr. Frank Benest. (Dr. Benest is a former city manager and a well-known local agency consultant who presented at a recent CASA Conference). The employee engagement topic was the main focus of the Leadership Team Retreat, which led to the development of a formal program for employee engagement at the District as an on-going strategic initiative. This initiative is meant to support the District’s Strategic Goal #2:

Develop a highly qualified work force to ensure a continuously high performing organization with sufficient resilience and redundancy to thrive in the face of staffing transitions.

An interdisciplinary employee engagement team has been established, and are it is currently developing program elements. The first key piece of the program was the development of an Employee Engagement Survey, replacing our former employee satisfaction survey conducted in 2014. Staff will present an overview of the results of the 2018 Employee Engagement survey to the Board.

The next step will be the introduction of an “Employee Academy” which will build on suggestions from the survey. The Employee Academy will help with onboarding of new staff through a District-wide orientation program based in part on the successful elements of the Citizens Water Academy program. The Employee Academy will also include tours of District facilities and introductions to key staff, and is planned for an October rollout.

TITLE: Receive Presentation on Successful Implementation of a Potable Reuse Project: Pure Water Monterey

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Board of Directors receive a presentation on the Pure Water Monterey Groundwater Replenishment Project.

SUMMARY:

Through participation in the Tri-Valley Water Liaison Committee, the District and the water agencies in the Tri-Valley are taking steps towards improving water supply reliability by considering potable reuse and other water supply alternatives. The Monterey Peninsula communities have faced similar water supply reliability issues as the Tri-Valley and have successfully implemented the Pure Water Monterey Project to address them.

Pure Water Monterey is a groundwater replenishment water supply project to provide multiple benefits to the Monterey Peninsula. The project will produce 5.0 million gallons per day (MGD) of advanced purified water to add to that region's water supply. The project reuses urban wastewater, agricultural return flow, agricultural produce wash water, and stormwater. It benefits the region as follows:

1. Reduces diversion from the Carmel River by up to 3,500 acre-feet per year (AFY);
2. Injects up to 3,500 AFY into the Seaside Basin, to protect the groundwater basin from seawater intrusion and to provide drought-proof water supply for urban use;
3. Provides 600 AFY of recycled water for landscape irrigation for Marina Coast Water District; and,
4. Provides 4,500 to 4,750 AFY of recycled water for agricultural irrigation.

In addition to providing the above benefits, it reduces wastewater effluent discharge into the marine sanctuary and preserves flows in the Carmel River for wildlife habitat.

Monterey One Water and Monterey Peninsula Water Management District led the effort for the project. The path to implementation required collaboration and agreements between these lead agencies and seven other entities: City of Salinas, City of Seaside, Fort Ord Reuse Authority, Marina Coast Water District, Monterey County, Monterey County Water Resources Agency, and Monterey Regional Waste Management District. The Boards and Councils of these agencies see this project as one of the most important projects for the region and it unified them. Pure Water Monterey is currently under construction and expected to deliver water starting summer 2019.

The success of Pure Water Monterey provides an example for agencies who are seeking to improve their water supply reliability.

Staff will show a brief video clip on Pure Water Monterey at the Board meeting.
