



WATER USE AND CONSERVATION TARGET




RECYCLED WATER PROGRAM


DSRSD July 2022 Consumption

DROUGHT OUTREACH



- **End of June – Sent 156 letters to potable irrigation customers for non-compliance**

— Responses from customers

✓ Finding leak and adjusting irrigation schedule

- **Mid July – Mailed 23,500 June Water Use Reports to residential customers**

DROUGHT OUTREACH


Inquiry	DSRSD Response
Fine for not meeting conservation target	No fine is imposed. However, if a higher conservation target is required, a drought fine may be considered by DSRSD Board.
Similar home usage calculation	If home address falls within a Tract, the average water use for all homes within that Tract is presented in the Water Use Report
Unhappy face on report	Providing information to customers that report is an additional tool for them to easily understand their monthly water use
Do not have AquaHawk account	Provide information how to sign up and setup notification.


DIGITAL OUTREACH

- Issued July *Pipeline* newsletter to 13,000 customers featured on AquaHawk for real-time monitoring and leak notification
- Promoted DSRSD’s Assistant GM’s Virtual Update about Drought Conditions and Water Conservation



CA WATER SUPPLY UPDATE



- Governor announced a new Water Supply Strategy Plan on August 11th
- By 2040, CA existing water supply will be reduced by up to 10% due to hotter and drier weather
- Plan identified targeted actions to address the reduction in water supply
 - New Supply Storage
 - Recycled Water
 - Efficiency and Conservation
 - New Water (i.e. stormwater, desalination)

- Monitor water usage of potable dedicated irrigation customers and residential customers
